The SAT Reasoning Test measures your critical thinking skills that are needed for academic success in college. The SAT assesses your ability to analyze and solve problems. These are skills you learned in school that you will need in order to be successful in college. The SAT is generally taken by the end of Grade 11.

Each section of the SAT test is scored on a scale of 200-800, with two writing sub scores for multiple choice and the essay. The SAT is administered six times a year in Canada. The sections included in the SAT are as follows: critical reading, mathematics, and a writing section.
